## THE ARAB BRITISH CENTRE

The Arab British Centre is a UK registered charity whose mission is to promote understanding of the Arab world within Britain. SAFAR Film Festival, its flagship project, is a biennial film festival held in London, and the only film festival solely programming cinema from across the Arab world in the UK.

The fourth edition of SAFAR – titled 'A Literary Journey Through Arab Cinema' – was themed around the longstanding relationship of literature and film, inspired by a collaboration with Banipal Magazine of Modern Arab Literature. The festival was curated by Egyptian film critic Joseph Fahim, and screenings took place across three venues: the ICA and, for the first time, the Institut Français and Kings College London.



# SAFAR HAS CROWN



SAFAR has grown in popularity, scope, and size since its inception in 2012. Previous editions have included 'A Celebration of Contemporary Arab Cinema' (2016); 'The Festival of Popular Arab Cinema' (2014); and 'A Journey Through Popular Arab Cinema' (2012). The fourth edition's theme of literature and film was set to hone in on a more niche aspect of Arab cinema, whilst broadening the discussion to include two disciplines, and a greater appreciation of arts from the Arab world.




#### Three exhibitions to see in London this weekend

The art of Arab cinema and literature are being brought together for this year's edition of Safar ♂ (until 18 September), a bi-annual festival of films from the Middle East. Hosted by the Institute of Contemporary Arts and the Institut Français, and organised by the Arab British Centre, the line-up includes a selection of 1960s film noir and contemporary films inspired by Arab literature from tales by Naguib Mahfouz to the classic story of One Thousand and One Nights. Many of the films have never been shown outside of the Middle East. This weekend you can see a selection of contemporary short films; newly restored versions of the classic films Opium and the Baton (1977) and The Land (1969); and the UK premiere of the Tunisian film In the Land of Tararanni (1973), an adaptation of Ali Douagi's book Sleepless Nights that captures the zeitgeist of the pre-independence period in the country.
